Whereas, NHSA's Celebrate Day 366... Every Baby Deserves a Chance Infant Mortality Awareness Campaign supports and inspires people from around the nation to take action in support of the Healthy People 2030 goal to improve the health and well-being of women, infants, children and families; and

Whereas, NHSA has promoted the month of September as National Infant Mortality Awareness Month since 2007 to bring awareness to the Campaign Day 366...Every Baby Deserves a Chance Infant Mortality Awareness Campaign; and

**Whereas**, 2022 is the 15<sup>th</sup> year of this Campaign and Awareness Month;
